Artist Research

Pick an Artist

Select one of the artists from the list below that works in a way that inspires you.. Research their work, their times, and their context.

a. Sketchbook

Use your sketchbook as a means of documenting and also reflecting: take down the artist's information, any stylistic/artistic information, and sketch out any inspiring ideas.

Write a Paper

Write a 300-400 word paper about your artist, make sure that this is in your own words and ensure that you are thinking of the whole artist- time period, current events, artists of that same era, biographical information. Include at the end of the document a photograph of at least 3 pages of notes/sketching.

Create Artwork

Create a 2D/3D work (whichever AP you are assigned to) of art that is inspired by your research. This must be an exhibition quality work and you must have sketchbook images, notes, and reflections to support it.
