Creative Writing Summer Homework 2023

Grade 12 Arts and Communication Capstone Due August 17, 2023 50 points

Reading journal

12 font, single-spaced, with headers including your last name, "RJ" and the page.

The reading journal contains evidence of what you read (titles, authors, book or publication titles if you are reading a book of essays, a book chapter, or an article in a newspaper, for example). The journal contains quotes that illustrate what you notice about style, experimentation, methods of accomplishing specific literary tasks (characterization, time shift, setting, theme, imagery etc.). The reading journal should demonstrate your observations and reactions in careful, thoughtful, original prose. A student once created a magnificent poem from lines in their reading journal. You could be working on the draft of one of your Winter 2023 Boards pieces. *In* your RJ, story or essay and poems, I want you to keep in mind the reasons that human beings create, refine and share works of art. Why are these cultural artifacts part of our world? How do they connect us? What do they help us discover? Use these pieces of language (world, connect, discovery) explicitly in your analysis. Actively seek and articulate the insights that enduring and celebrated writing contains. All summer work should relate in some way to your Capstone investigation. This can and should be a very broad net – learning should contain surprises, and if your Capstone leads you somewhere you didn't expect to go – intellectually, artistically – that is ideal.

Short story or literary nonfiction essay

Complete and polished short story draft of 10-15 pages or literary/creative nonfiction of 10 pages. 12 font, single spaced.

Read at least four short stories or literary essays that have been selected for special notice (for example, published in a Best Short Stories/Best Nonfiction anthology, awarded a literary prize, etc.). I suggest two that were published within the last 10 years, and two that are more than 10 years old. Identify one that you particularly admire, because it achieves an effect you have never successfully achieved or have never tried to achieve or never thought to achieve. Write about all of this, with examples, in your RJ. Do not choose stories/essays you have already read or that are included in high school textbooks or reading lists. Do research to find new reading.

Poetry

Two complete and polished poems.

Read multiple poems by at least four poets whose work has been selected for special notice (literary prize, for example). Choose poets you have not read, and who do not appear in high school textbooks or reading lists. Do research. Make discoveries. Document your searches and your reading in your RJ. Compose and revise two poems, both of which can be inspired by the work of one poet, if they explore different styles or forms, or by two of the poets you read. Explain in your RJ what you seek to do that you have observed in the poets' work.

Read at least one interview by each of four of the fiction writers/poets you have read for the tasks above. Four interviews total. Document what you read (you can also listen to interviews) or hear with quotes and your responses. Write what you are learning, what you are thinking about that is new.

Journalism

Read articles from reputable news sources at least once a week. These should be about a diverse range of subjects, leaning toward subjects you know least about, whether that be architecture, science, health, design, theater, education, economics, politics, etc. Make entries in your RJ with interesting quotes, facts, vocabulary. Be sure to include the source, title, and writer.
